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FROM THE **GENERAL SECRETARY'S** DESK

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Praise God. I am happy to reach you through this last issue of Chalk and Chai 46:4 (Oct to Dec 2023). This issue is a special one which includes more articles, messages and greetings from well-wishers former leaders and pioneers of ETF ministry. Special thanks to every one of them. I am grateful to each and every one of you who support and pray for the ETF ministry.

Through the themes of Chalk and Chai during this year, "Education and Creation, Education and Fall, Education and Redemption, Education and Restoration, we have been focusing on how these four acts of Creation narrative are integrated into the present education system and our responsibility as Christian educators. The theme of this issue, "Education and Restoration" and the theme of the upcoming 23rd Biennial National Conference, "A Call to Build and Rebuild", have aligned so beautifully!

All buildings are built with the same common components such as founda-

tions, walls, floors, rooms, and roofs, and involve many other accessories. The foundation is the most crutial work of building construction. Every component of a building has to utilize proper genuine materials and involve a variety of workers. Each category of the building has its own structure following certain restrictions and regulations. The buildings are used for several purposes. **But all the buildings and structures on this earth are non-living things. They don't have life. They can be destroyed due to natural calamities or human - induced distasters.**

But the Bible says the people of God are God's house, the '**Building** - **a Growing Building with Life!'** "We are His house, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets. And the cornerstone is Christ Jesus himself" (Eph 2:20-22).

Right Foundation

It's a common scene and practice to observe, before any building construction work starts, one corner of the foundation to be laid is marked and piled with a few bricks to form a corner and people have a simple ceremony with a prayer and begin the work. The building work already started 2000 years ago with the Cornerstone of the foundation as Jesus Christ Himself - The Word. Apostles and Prophets continued the foundation work. *Every one of us is a builder to build on the right foundation to grow as a building. We are called to help others to stack their building above us with the right foundation like Skyscrapers.* A load of buildings depends on the foundation which is the strength of buildings.

Beautiful educational institutions with attractive infrastructures. comfortable desks for children, smart classrooms, good libraries, virtual labs, and facilities for various skill developments are essential to lav a foundation to build the career, skills, and knowledge of the students. But as Christian educators, we are called to build the lives of people and we have to be careful in picking up the building materials for the foundation for life. Fear of God is the beginning of wisdom and Jesus said, "Those who hear His words and do them are wise builders (Mt. 7:24-27). They have built their homes on rock-solid foundations (deep foundations as per the present technology!) The house stands firm when the winds howl, the rains and floods come. Those who hear His words, but fail to live by them are foolish builders (Shallow foundations!).

Renovation

As a growing building, first, we have to build ourselves on the right foundation - a strong foundation, by obeying his word and in the fear of God. If not, when inspection comes where we have to be standing witnesses for God, our part of the building will be torn out and has to be started over. Then our lives need 'Renovation' to restore our witnessing life!

Renovation involves both interior and exterior.

Right materials of good quality in right proportion have to be used to join the bricks, plaster the walls, and pave the floor and fix the doors and windows. Fach work needs different kinds of tools and workmanship. Building maintenance is very important to retain and restore the functionality of any kind of building. It includes tasks such as cleaning, landscaping, electrical and plumbing system and time to time renovation. As God's children when we grow as a building, we are growing as His Temple and Spirit of God dwells in us. God's temple is Holv and Sacred and any kind of sinful practices, selfishness, and lack of faith in God and lack of obedience to God's word will cause damage to the building to leave the building useless.

As Christian educators, we are called to do renovation in the lives of others/ youngsters – to build and rebuild their lives with the fear of God, Character building, the right relationship with God, people, and careers. To do such renovation, our space, time, and energy have to be invested in the lives of people with Biblical principles as tools.

If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay, or straw, it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss but yet will be saved. If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for God's temple is sacred, and you together are that temple. (1Cor.3:12-16).

Restoration

We have a purposeful and meaningful life not only to grow as a building but build the younger generation along with us to grow as Kingdom people in this world. Bible says the builder is rewarded when we inherit the Kingdom of God. Like Nehemiah, it is our responsibility to restore the purpose of education to be holistic by renovating the broken walls in the education system through our professional and witnessing life.

The Bible has many insights about buildings projecting the triune God as the greatest architect and engineer of buildings. To build the Ark by Noah, the Tabernacle by Moses, or the Temple of Jerusalem by Solomon - In every construction we find Men and women who worked as laborers to fulfill God's plan. With a willing mind, they obeyed God's instruction. They carried out the exact pattern and structure for both the interior and exterior. They used the materials and methods prescribed by God. When the people were needed to bring contributions, with willing hear-ts, they were moved to give generous offerings to the Lord. The Walls of Jerusalem rebuilt by Nehemiah was restored. They all accomplished the work assigned to them.

God is interested in building and rebuilding people - He works in us - He wants to work through us to renovate and restore His people to grow as Kingdom People. God Bless you.



Regarding the Biennial National Conference theme, "Build and Rebuild" we understand our God is the prime architect. He designed an ark to save Noah and his family from his judgement to come. King Solomon built a temple in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord which would attract people from every nation, because of the mighty acts of the Lord. Yet because of the breaking of the covenant by the people of God they were sent into captivity and the temple and its surrounding walls were in decay and disarray. God moved the heart of a Persian King who sent men to rebuild the temple and the walls. They did rebuild. The truth is that we are the temple of the Holy God and the Spirit of God lives therein and the one desecrates this temple will be destroyed says the Lord. Abraham the father of faith was looking for a city whose builder and architect is God. John the beloved saw Jerusalem coming down. Jesus declared I go to my Father to prepare a place for you (there are many mansions) I will come back to receive you. Peter in his second epistle says that the one who has this hope purifies himself for we do not know when he returns.

So God in his love and mercy has restored us and given us eternal life. Let us be vigilant and live for him.





Recently, this July, we all admired the launch of the Chandrayaan - III mission to Moon by the Indian Space Department. The rocket goes into space with a great speed and puts the mission module into the orbit From there it is to be transferred to the surface of the Moon. The rocket has to follow a predetermined path so that it reaches the right point in space at the right time with the right speed. But the unexpected disturbances like air gusts, change in weather conditions, deviation in the engine performance etc. could make the rocket to depart from its planned path. lf unchecked, it could cause a failure. But the meticulously designed automatic guidance system continuously monitors the path of the rocket, measures the deviations and immediately applies the corrective measures and brings back the rocket to the original trajectory, without any human intervention during the flight.

Similar situation can happen in our spiritual life too, in the life of an individual, a family, a church or a nation. Once we fail to follow God's laws and to obey Him, we deviate from His plan. If unchecked, the deviation enlarges day by day and the situation ends up in *catastrophe*. The fellowship between God and us is broken, joy and happiness is replaced by hopelessness and gloom, victory becomes defeat. Bible is full of such historical events where individuals like Adam and Eve, several kings in Israel or Israel as a nation went away from God's planned path and got into misery. In some cases the restoration took place and in other cases it didn't.

Our Heavenly Father, out of love, has provided means for us so that we can always come back to the God-planned life for us. Lord Jesus came down to the world for this very purpose of reconciliation, restoring the relationship with God which man had lost in the Garden of Eden [Lk.19:10]. He has given us the *responsibility* of continuing the restoration process [II Cor. 5:18]. We as teachers are called to use our profession for that purpose.

The young people whom we handle or guide are school or college students. They are taught to be good, morally right, loving, caring etc. Nobody tells them or advises them to go wrong. But external influences sow the seed of sin in their mind, just as the external disturbances deviate the rocket. Most of us would have come across instants where how media, mobile phones, peer pressure has spoiled the lives of many young people. God has placed us as teachers, to protect them from falling prey to the devil's plans, and restore them if they have failed, by our *influence* through the teaching ministry.

The book of Nehemiah is a great source of inspiration when one thinks of restoration or rebuilding. A good Christian teacher should have a good knowledge of that book and apply some of the principles found in it so that the teacher serves as a good rebuilder.

PERSONAL LIFE:

The control and guidance system of the rocket should be in perfect state, so that it can work to bring the huge rocket back, when it deviates. So also our spiritual lives must be in tune with God's overall plan. Paul says that his aim is to please God [II Cor.5:9] before he talks about the ministry of reconciliation. Our relationship with God should be perfect, by daily spending time with Him in prayer and meditating on His Word, so that we can be used by Him to restore broken relationships and lives. We see Nehemiah as a man of prayer, praying frequently.

BURDEN:

Nehemiah was sad to hear about the sorry state of Jerusalem's damaged walls. Immediately the burden of the broken city walls pressed on him and he wept. He fasted and prayed. We should have a similar burden for the lost young people, who sit in our classrooms. Having a burden for the lost is the main driving force for any mission. Nehemiah's burden had directed him to do all he could to complete the restoration of the walls. He was a man of prayer and obeyed God's law, but the driving force behind his ministry was his burden for the lost. This was the reason for our Lord Jesus crying for Jerusalem. [Lk. 13:34]

ALERTNESS:

We should always be on the lookout for students who need to be restored. There may be a girl there in your classroom, a victim of domestic violence, or a boy with other issues who need to be counselled. Their facial expressions and lack of participation in the classroom activities can reveal their state of mind. While teaching the subject, the Christian teacher should be on the lookout for such students who need their help. Before rebuilding the wall, Nehemiah was looking for the damages on the wall, so that he can plan a strategy to rebuild. [Neh.2:13-15]

STRATEGY:

We see godly principles with which Nehemiah went about his ministry of rebuilding. He was successful in setting up a *team*, as he knew the fruitfulness of teamwork. [Neh. 3] Christian teachers should have fellowship with other Christian colleagues, which may not be possible always, especially in non-Christian schools.

Nehemiah had a strategy to overcome the enemies. [Neh. 4:9,13,14] As Christian teachers we face difficulty and opposition in our workplaces when we try to rebuild lives. We have to be careful and wise to do the right thing, and not lose our credentials and witness. Holy Spirit will guide us to manage the situation.

Ultimately, rebuilding and restoration of lives is the work of God. lord Jesus came to this world as a human being, for the same purpose, and He will use us. if we commit our lives to serve him, and will give us the wisdom, strategies, protection that are needed to accomplish His mission through us, as Christian teachers.

I had the privilege of being Editor for this important book; and also later for two other titles, namely, 'Teacher Speaks', in 1995 and 'The Making of a Christian Teacher' in 1998. I am happy to report that the last-named book has been translated into the Mizo language and published by the ETF Mizoram for the use of teachers in schools and colleges in Mizoram. I hope and pray that the Lord will use this book to Build a strong force of Christian Teachers and to Rebuild Mizoram in the field of Education and perhaps in other areas also. I would like to request all of you kindly pray about this new effort – a special ministry to, for, and by the Christian teachers in Mizoram.



We build walls to safeguard valuable things and to protect ourselves from our enemies. We read in Jeremiah 5:22 that our Creator God has put a wall of sand to control the sea! (NLV).

God has placed walls of protection around His children. "Just as Jerusalem is protected by mountains on every side, the LORD protects his people by holding them in his arms now and forever" (Psalms 125:2 CEV). Psalm 91 portrays that Almighty God covers us with His feathers and His faithfulness is a protective shield. (V4 HCSB). This truth is revealed in the life of Job. Satan acknowledged God's wall of protection around Job and everything he owned. (Job 1:9)

We, the educators and our institutions can be a blessing to our students and our nation only if we have God's wall of protection around us. To be the salt and light in this sinful world, one should know the reasons for God breaking protective walls in our lives and the remedies.

1. God opens the protective walls, to test our faith.

Satan accused Job that he feared God and had been a man of integrity, because of God's wall of protection around him, his family, and his property. He challenged that Job would curse God and leave his faith in Him if He removed His wall of protection (Job 1:9-11 NLT).

In response to Satan's challenge, God removed His wall of protection around Job, so as to test and prove his faithfulness and integrity. Job not only lost all his possessions but also his ten godly children on the same day! Then he also lost his health. God allowed Satan to touch Job and made him suffer to such an extent that his wife, who was expected to comfort and console him in this worst situation, advised him to curse God and die. Instead, Job praised God!

(Job 1:12-2:10) He even confessed, "Even if God kills me, I will hope in Him". (Job 13:15 HCSB). Finally, Job passed the test and the LORD blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning, including another ten children through his wife! If the protective walls in your life are broken, don't be discouraged. Continue to be faithful to our Lord and He will surely bless you more abundantly.

2. God opens the protective walls to reform us.

In Psalm 80 (HCSB), Asaph recollects the prosperous and glorious days of Israel in verses 8-11. But he laments over her pathetic condition in verses 12 and 13. "But now, why have you broken down our walls so that all who pass by may steal our fruit? The wild boar from the forest devours it, and the wild animals feed on it".

Why did it happen? Because of their disobedience to God. That's why Asaph pleads to God, "Revive us, and we will call upon Your name. Restore us, O LORD God of hosts; Cause Your face to shine, and we shall be saved!" (VV 18,19). When we disobey God, He removes the protective walls around us and we lose our blessings. If your walls are broken, due to your disobedience to God, now is the time to repent and return to our Lord. He is ready to forgive and restore your life and institution to former glory. "Come and let us return [in repentance] to the LORD, For He has torn us, but He will heal us; He has wounded us, but He will bandage us" (Hosea 6:1 Amp). God's Promise: Instead of shame and dishonour, you shall have a double portion of prosperity and everlasting joy (Isaiah 61:7 TLB).

However, I wish the best to all of you and pray that your gathering will be a time of learning, introspection, and renewed commitment to be better and more effective teachers to rebuild and restore the great nation of India and beyond.

Every born-again Christian should be committed to the call of God to "build and rebuild" (Jer. 31:4). God guaranteed the people of Israel that He will bring them from captivity and restore them to their homeland. He assured them that He will bless them by His everlasting love. Israel will be rebuilt spiritually and physically. There will be joy, dancing, and abundance. Education is the means to rebuild and transform our society. It is a process of accelerating learning and acquiring knowledge, values, and virtue. It influences the development of better people and society. In the Christian context, education must be coupled with the kingdom values of Jesus Christ in order to make an eternal impact.

Let us consider some of the important ways we can build and rebuild our people and communities.

1. Better Teachers

Teachers impart knowledge and values as role models. Most of our teachers are wonderful. Yet we can continue to learn and grow to be more effective teachers. Today there is a gap between teachers and students. We must pour our lives to build the next generation of transformational leaders with intellectual, spiritual, and moral capacity. Teachers are called to be creative and innovative in order to restore and rebuild our broken society. C. S. Lewis remarks that, "The task of the modern educator is not to cut down jungles, but to irrigate deserts." Almost 25% of India is still illiterate. This must be reversed. This can be done only with teachers who are passionate and have a servant heart to change lives.

2. People of Integrity

Integrity is antithetical to the spirit of the current age. Integrity is being honest and consistent. It means my words match up with my deeds. Joseph was respected, honored, and became the second in command in Egypt because he was a man of integrity. Teachers play a huge role very early on developing this virtue in the hearts of their pupils. C. S. Lewis said, "Integrity is doing the right thing even when no one is watching."

3. Compassion for Brokenness

Compassion is a attribute of God. We know Jesus had compassion when he saw the crowd because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Today we live in a broken society and broken people are in our homes, churches, workplace, and in our neighborhood. Without genuine compassion, we cannot rebuild and restore people and society. Ministry is the result of God-given compassion. If we are not moved to action, our compassion is not genuine, but simply pity on people or situations. Nehemiah was not a priest, but an ordinary believer with power in the king's palace. When he heard about

4. Confidence in God

As children of God, we must have absolute trust in God. We must believe in the promises of God. He said to the people of Israel, "I will build you up again and you will be rebuilt." What God said he would do for His own reputation, he did in a spectacular way. Great men and women who transform the world, were people of great confidence in God. Mother Theresa touched millions of lives. Hudson Taylor rescued millions from darkness to light. Amy Carmichael gave hope to thousands of girls. All of them were able to do mighty things, not because of their abundance of resources, but by their confidence in God.

5. Imago Dei

Everyone is created in the image of God. We must believe this fundamental truth in order to build and rebuild. God created male and female in His own image and likeness. We must value every person whether people are poor, rich, Brahman, untouchable, black, white, etc. Unfortunately, in this broken world, there is much injustice and discrimination on the basis of ethnicity, age, sex, and religion. The Manipur violence against innocent Christians reminds us this evil is still strongly prevalent in our society. We must teach our children and youth to value and respect all people equally, in order to build a better society.

6. Transformational Leaders

They serve as a catalyst to help others recognize their God-given assets, what God has already entrusted to them and to identify ways to put these assets to use as a good steward in the service of others. We need courageous risk takers who will see societal brokenness as an opportunity for transformation by collaboration. Nehemiah collaborated with many people, including the king, in order to rebuild the broken walls of Jerusalem and transform lives. India needs transformational leaders who are godly, courageous, passionate, humble, and willing to risk their lives for developing a better society.

Let us sincerely respond to the call of God to build and restore our broken systems and societies with godly, sustainable, and effective programs. Nelson Mandela argues, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." Educators have a significant role to play in instilling this vision in our young generation so that they will grow to become powerful transformational leaders with genuine compassion, servanthood, integrity, clear vision, commitment, and communication. Jesus commanded us to be salt and light through our words and deeds in order to be a better nation together so that our Father in heaven will be glorified (Matt. 5:13-16).

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Education is seen as an organized system and a formal process; teachers are seen as professionals in the system. Instead of getting into the discussion of defining education and the role of teachers, I would like to focus on the overall purpose of education, whether it is formal or informal. The purpose of education is the life transformation of students.

The greatest opportunity for the teachers is being in the center of the life of students, the next generation during their formative age. Though the next generation is advanced in using digital and social media, there is more opportunity for them to learn and develop. How to transform the life of the next generation? This has been a great challenge for the current generation of teachers.

If we like to see the transformation in the next generation, we need to have the same approach that Jesus had towards us. Where else we can go, except to Jesus, our LORD? In Matthew 11:29, we read the invitation of Jesus to learn from Him.

"Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

Jesus is the role model for us. If we reflect on Philippians 2:6-8, [who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross.] we can see three key principles that Jesus demonstrated.

1. Surrendering to God's PURPOSE

Jesus is the evidence of God's love for the whole world. (John 3:16, Romans 5:8) Jesus was conscious of the purpose for which He was sent into this world and therefore, He surrendered to God's purpose.

It is very important for us as teachers to recognize God's purpose for our life. We need to ask following these questions: Why has God placed me in this role? What is He trying to fulfil through me in the place where God has kept me? I like to challenge us to script God's purpose for us. I call God's purpose for our life as our Personal Vision.

Unless we keep our eyes on God's purpose for our life, we cannot understand the process through which He has been taking us.

2. Surrendering to God's PROCESS

The process for Jesus was to become man, emptying His position in heaven, becoming man and a bond servant; this was a tough thing to embrace. Surrendering to God's purpose may be easier; it is harder to surrender to God's process. Often, it is very difficult for us to understand the process through which God is taking us.

Apostle Peter who preached so strongly on God's purpose (Acts2:23) to Israelites, could not understand the process of God when he was taken from the Israelites to gentiles! In Acts 10, we read the process that God took Peter through a vision and his refusal to follow God's command.

Preaching to Israelites was Peter's comfort zone; it was hard for Peter to get out of it. When God wants to take us out of our comfort zone, He takes us through His own ways. His ways are not our ways. (Isaiah 55:8-9) The prayer of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:39 & Mark 14:36) shows the pain Jesus had gone through while surrendering to His father's process: the separation from His Father's presence for a while carrying the sins of the world in the cross of Calvary.

God's process for us may be so intensive that we would like to get away from it. We may understand the purpose of God but not be willing go through His ways, the process!

We also read in the scriptures the process, Mary, the mother of Jesus had gone through. Being in Eastern culture, we can easily understand the stigma of an unmarried woman being pregnant and the possibilities of the fiancé's rejection and the humiliation. Despite all these, when she had the words of the Angel,

Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name JESUS. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him

Unless we keep our eyes on God's purpose for our life, we cannot understand the process through which He has been taking us. the throne of His father David. Luke 1: 30-32

Mary had understood the purpose and the process God had set before her; her only question was how this would happen!

And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. Luke 1:35

When Mary heard these words, she surrendered herself to the purpose, process and power of God. Are we willing to go through the God's process, though operating beyond our comfort zone?

3. Surrendering to God's POWER

Jesus knew the power of God will be demonstrated at the CROSS! Therefore, He stripped Himself of all privileges and rightful dignity to yield to the process, His Heavenly Father was taking Him through.

What is the power of God?

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 1 Corinthians 1:18

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. Romans 1:16

Because of Jesus's obedience, submission & surrender, the POWER of GOD is going to be exhibited on the life of everyone who believes. Sometimes we tend to do things in our own strength. Peter tried it!

Peter said to Him, "Lord, why can I not follow you now? I will lay down my life for your sake."

Jesus answered him, "Will you lay down your life for my sake? Most assuredly, I say to you, the rooster shall not crow till you have denied Me three times. John 13:37-38

Though Peter failed miserably and later wept bitterly for his denial of Jesus, he was not fully aware of the process through which Jesus was leading him. As we read in John 21, the focus of Jesus was making Peter to follow Him in love.

The above detailed three principles, "Surrendering to God's purpose, process and power" must be undergirded by His love. Bible constantly reminds us of His love.

"Yes, I have loved you with an everlasting love; Therefore with loving kindness I have drawn you. Jeremiah 31:2

Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus! (Philippians 2:5 NKJV)

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, (Philippians 2:5 NASB)

Greetings to you in the most powerful and sweetest Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to everyone !

At the outset, we both wish you all who have decided to attend the Biennial National Conference -2023. May our Lord and Saviour richly bless you and use you all mightily among the students , teachers and others.

There are 3 building blocks of relationships with man and God we learn from the Life of Abraham as depicted in Genesis chapter 18.

- 1. Show hospitality
- 2. Close communion with God
- 3. Obedience to God and encourage others to Obey

Firstly, we see that while he was sitting in the tent door in the heat of the day, he lifted his eyes and beheld 3 men who were standing by him. He ran towards them, met them, bowed himself to the ground and requested them to rest under the tree. He brought water to wash their feet, and then took 3 measures of flour to make bread for them and asked his young man to cook a tender and young calf. Sarah, his wife without grumbling, kneaded that flour and made cakes out of it and Abraham served these with tender beef curry. That is real hospitality.

Our Bible commends us to be hospitable through several scriptures. "Be hospitable to one another without grumbling" (1Peter4:9). "Distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality" (Romans 12:13b). "Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels". (Hebrews 13:2)

If we want to build and rebuild our Lord's Kingdom, be hospitable to one another. The first thing is to open your home and make it a haven of rest, relaxation, refreshment and to find out their personal, physical and spiritual needs and try to meet those needs individually or collectively as a group of teachers. Secondly, we read in Genesis 18: 17a "Shall I hide from Abraham what I am doing?" This shows the intimate relationship with our Lord so much that our Lord wants to share His secrets with us, His creation. As teachers and mentors, our relationship with our Lord and with His Word should be SO STRONG that our Lord Himself wants to share the future plans with us. "The secret of the Lord is with those who fear Him" (Psalm 25: 14).

How is our time with the Lord and with His Word? Do we spend quality time with our Saviour and with His Word? Unless we are saturated with the Word of God, we cannot be proper guides, leaders, teachers or mentors. Let us introspect this aspect in each of our lives.

Thirdly, the Lord commends Abraham saying, "For I have known him, in order that he may command his children and his household after him. that they keep the way of the Lord to do righteousness and justice"(Genesis 18:19). Here we see that Abraham won the trust of our Lord that he would command His children and his household to walk in Godly ways. True, he did it faithfully. God said, 'circumcise your children and all those who were born in your house'. He readily obeyed even though it was a painful thing to undergo. He first obeyed and he made others obey. That we see in his son Isaac's life.

Greatest demonstration of obedience by Abraham is seen when he surrendered to implicit obedience without asking a single question even when God asked Abraham to sacrifice his only beloved son. And he did it willingly, trusting God completely. Our duty as teachers and kingdom builders, we need to obey and guide others to obey all our Lord's commandments.

On the contrary we see a bad example in life of Priest Eli, who did not bring up his children in the fear of God. Our Lord says, "If you love ME, keep My commandments" (John 14:15). The greatest of all commandments stated by Jesus is "Love God and love your neighbour as yourself" (Mark 12: 30-31).

So in a nutshell, we can build, rebuild, restore and renew relationships with God and man by these 3 vital qualities :

- (1) Show hospitality
- (2) Have close communion with God and His Word
- (3) Obey God , and lead others to obey

Let us introspect where we have fallen short and rectify ourselves to be effective relationship builders in God's Kingdom and become His Mighty witnesses.

I consider it a great honour to be writing this word of greetings to you all on your 46th anniversary – I was keen on being with you all in Siliguri, but I had to change my plans because something else came up. My association with ETFI – as it was known in the beginning of the movement – started with writing its constitution along with the late Dr G Devapaul in the REC (now NIT), Warangal. I have been at some of your annual conferences and have had the joy of interacting with many of you.

I want to draw your attention as Christian teachers to the first commandment that God gives to the human pair in *Gen.1:28* – to be stewards of His creation and to work for human flourishing - (This is the best way of interpreting this verse). I have often wondered how it would be if Christian students considered their studies as qualifying them for obeying this commandment. I have also given considerable thought to what it would be like if Christian teachers had looked at their profession as equipping their students towards the same end. I am not complaining but have lately begun to think as to how we have come to read the Bible only for *therapeutic* – what we can get out of God – and for *utilitarian* – how to get God to do things for us – reasons. Please do not get me wrong – the very breath that I breathe in the 81st year of my life comes from Him; we also know that our personal and corporate salvation is a free gift of His grace, worked out through the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

I have come to the above conclusion because we seem to have a strong theology of *redemption* but a rather weak theology of *creation*; obviously, I do not mean that we believe in a purposeless, unguided, impersonal, evolutionistic beginning to the universe. What I mean to say is that we are not beginning to take God's creation seriously in our study and work. We fail to realise that the scope of salvation in Christ is not limited to humans but embraces the whole of creation – *Col.1:19,20; Eph.1:9,10*. The Bible ends, not with a reference to heaven, but with the renewal of all creation – *Rev.21:1-5*. The Church, beautifully dressed as the Bride of Christ, comes **down** to rule over God's new creation – *Rev.22:5* – in other words, our stewardship will continue into the new creation as well.

If this is the purpose for which God created us humans, then our study and work assume tremendous importance and significance. The Bible is not reduced to the level of a *religious* book but is seen as a book of all *reality*. We have replaced <u>Gen.1:28</u> with the great commission of *Matt.28:18-20*, instead of viewing both as part of one brilliant plan of Almighty God. My prayer for the ETF, as you celebrate this anniversary, is that your members will see the teaching profession as a calling from God towards the fulfilment of His brilliant, combined commandment.

Luke 19:1-10

It is not always a pleasant thing to have quite an amount to be taken from our income as an Income Tax, even though out of a sense of responsibility as faithful citizens, we know we are to pay the tax annually. The people of Israel in the time of Jesus' earthly ministry were so averse to have to pay taxes to the unwanted Roman authorities who they looked upon as oppressors. That was why they hated their fellow Israelites who were in the service of the Roman Government in the collection of their taxes. They hated such persons all the more when they usually got more than their dues by fraud, which they knew. That was why Mr. Zacchaeus, the "Tax Commissioner" at Jericho was so distasteful to them. The city being rich in natural resources was an ideal place for locating tax-collection office and for corruption. So, Zacchaeus was like a social outcast among his people. He was wealthy but not happy. He had much but was lonely. It could be that the Holy Spirit spoke to him earlier that he wanted to see Jesus who then was famous as a Man of God who accepted sinners, tax collectors and prostitutes. There must be something for him in the popular Rabbi. Jesus planned to pass through Jericho at noon time on his way to Jerusalem. Zacchaeus was so desperate that he did not care about what the people would think of him perching himself up there on the fig tree. He would have no chance to meet the Man of God passing through his town. But what, if he could only see him from the branch of the tree.

Luke does not tell us how it was that Jesus "reached the spot" where Zacchaeus was climbing on the tree, "looked" up and saw Zacchaeus in the tree. It may be that the attention of the all-knowing Son of God, who does never overlook the desperate soul's need of men and women was drawn to him, and he "looked up" and saw him. Zacchaeus, who only expected to have just a glimpse of him walking pass, had no time to do or say anything to him when their eyes met. Jesus took the initiative and called him by name and asked him to come down immediately. "I must stay at your house today," he said. This was much more than Zacchaeus' expectation. The one who had only wanted to "see' now was going to "host" him. He quickly came down and gladly welcomed him into his home. The general reaction of the crowd was usual. They never understood the mission of Jesus and the purpose of his coming to the world.

We are not told what kind of conversation went on between Zacchaeus and his great guest. Earlier, when a rich young and religious ruler met Jesus but refused to obey his instructions to part with his wealth and follow him, Jesus had made a remark

how it is so difficult for the rich man to enter the kingdom of God. Did Jesus say the same thing to Zacchaeus as he had said to the young ruler? If he did, then the response of Zacchaeus was so different. He stood up and said to the Lord, "I give half of my possessions to the poor (whom he had exploited), and if I have cheated anyone out of anything (which he may have often done), I will pay back four times the amount (which was far more than the law demanded)." What a transformation! What a restitution!

Jesus confirmed the change in Zacchaeus saying, "Today salvation has come to this house, because, this man, too is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost." This statement of Jesus has many implications. The meaning of salvation in this context is the liberation of a man from the enslavement of his ill-gained possessions. I recently heard one preacher telling about the family of his friend. They used to be poor earlier. They then become rich, by what means he did not clarify. When visited, the wife of the man told him how he longed for the time they were poor. There are many rich but lonely people because they are in the prisons of their ill-gained possessions. Zacchaeus was by blood the son of Abraham as a naturally born Israelite. But now, he was a new-born son of Abraham, which can mean he accepted Jesus as his Saviour and Lord and could now part with his possessions. He was led from desperation to transformation and then that led him to the power to make restitution. What made all these possible was the presence of Jesus Christ in his life. The man who only wanted to see Jesus, experienced him and the power of His words, and got the spiritual privilege of being the son of Abraham, the father of faith. True repentance leads to restitution of the wrong already done.



EDUCATION AND RESTORATION
